Position Overview

The Department of Pediatrics at Queen's University at Kingston invites applications for a Clinical Academic Cardiologist appointment. The successful candidate will play a key role in advancing clinical care and academic/scholarly service in the field of Pediatric Cardiology. This position is to fill an existing vacancy within the University.

The Department of Pediatrics at Queen's University at Kingston provides multidisciplinary tertiary care for Southeastern and Northern Ontario. The Department is a vibrant place for the delivery of outstanding clinical care, education, research, and advocacy for children and families. The clinical care is provided at the Kingston Health Sciences Centre, a tertiary academic center that serves the needs of communities in Southeastern and Northern Ontario.

The Department has a thriving Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada-accredited residency program. The Department prioritizes research excellence and has strong programs in clinical and translational research, with strong research support system and infrastructure. The Department supports the academic development of clinical faculty through specialized training, allocated academic time, access to departmental and university-based research infrastructure, and teaching development opportunities, consistent with the expectations of clinical academic appointments.

The successful incumbent will be expected to provide care in a range of settings including in-patient consultations and out-patient clinics. Outpatient responsibilities include at least two half-day in-person clinics per week and one half-day virtual clinic, in addition to participation in quarterly pediatric cardiology outreach clinics in Moose Factory.

The candidate must be skilled in the performance, interpretation and teaching of non-invasive cardiac diagnostic testing, including echocardiography, electrocardiography (ECG), ambulatory rhythm monitoring (Holter), and exercise stress testing (treadmill). This role requires close collaboration with the Cardiac Diagnostic Team, the existing pediatric cardiologist, the Maternal-Fetal Medicine program, and other pediatric subspecialties. The successful candidate will demonstrate expertise in both congenital and acquired heart diseases, including the management of complex congenital heart disease. Additional responsibilities include, active participation in multidisciplinary case discussions and presentations of cases at regional surgical and interventional cardiology conferences, as well as engagement in adult congenital heart disease transition of care. The position also includes participation in the Pediatric cardiology on-call schedule.

The successful incumbent will provide clinical teaching at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels and provide regular feedback and mentorship to trainees. Research and scholarship experience are welcome, as research is a core value of the Department.. Applicants need to have demonstrated the ability to work in an interdisciplinary, collaborative environment through their letter of application and references.



Qualified applicants will hold an MD degree (or equivalent) and be eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. Certification, or eligibility for certification, by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Pediatric Cardiology or equivalent is preferred. Candidates must demonstrate training and experience in Pediatric Cardiology, with additional expertise in fetal ECHO considered an asset.

Why Queen's

How to Apply

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals and is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity, and inclusion in the workplace. Queen's encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be given priority. Applicants are asked to indicate whether they have valid legal work status in Canada.
